 - **Q4** What do you think will happen if these problems are not solved?
 - Q5 Does the plan include any measures to promote respect and diversity?
 - Q6 What do you think would help this aim?
 - Q7 Do you think the plan recognizes the diversity of all the children and young people who live in your area?
 - **Q8** What do you think will help improve the Children and Young People's Plan?
